### November Kinder News

October was a very busy month! Routines have been established and the children are starting to make special friends and feel more independent.

Much time was spent working on learning some of the sounds and letters of the alphabet. Each week we focus on new letter sounds, learning actions that accompany them and practicing our printing. We will continue to work on letters and their sounds throughout the year. At this point in the year, children should recognize the letter name and sounds of: Pp, Uu, Oo, Mm, Xx, Aa and be developing their rhyming skills, which plays a very important part in their reading journey.

#### **NOVEMBER THEMES**

Remembrance Day, Peace, Seasonal Changes Letter/Sounds: d, t, s, and r.

Sample Learning Outcomes from the New Alberta Program of Studies:

- Practice listening and speaking skills through sharing oral stories
- Identify sounds at the beginning of spoken words
- Identify the number of syllables in one- to three-syllable words
- Ask questions about real people, places, or things to learn more about them
- The letter names and sounds for short vowels u, o & a, and consonants p, m, x, d, t, s, r
- Create a repeating pattern with up to three repeating elements
- Explore a variety of seasonal physical activities
- Recognize changes in weather and how both people and animals adapt
- Begin to understand and appreciate our own unique identities

We will continue to learn our alphabet sounds, practice rhyming and segmenting words into their syllables and sounds.

# PowerSchool

Learning is active in the Kindergarten classroom! PowerSchool is a reporting tool that helps us share how your child is progressing through Kindergarten. We will be using PowerSchool for both formative (ongoing) and summative (final) reporting. Formative assessment is used so caregivers can track how their student is doing as learning progresses. We will be reevaluating these skills as we build on them. When a summative mark has been provided it indicates that the learning being assessed has been completed.

Marks are colour coded to show you the difference between ongoing formative assessments and summative assessments.

Formative Assessments are green and will be identified like this:



Summative Assessments are purple and will be identified like this:



Kindergarten uses a grade scale of SI, SM, and SD to determine how much support your child requires to achieve a skill. The purpose of this is to also inform our teaching and to determine what your child needs to be successful in Kindergarten. We will contact you if we have a concern regarding your child's progress.
